It is a globally representative network integrating research, practice, and policy aiming at addressing climate-related health impacts. The members are from the Society for Prevention Research (SPR), the European Society for Prevention Research (EUSPR), the Asia-Pacific Society of Prevention Research (APSPR), the Brazilian Association for Research in Prevention and Health Promotion (BRAPEP), and other involved universities from different countries.

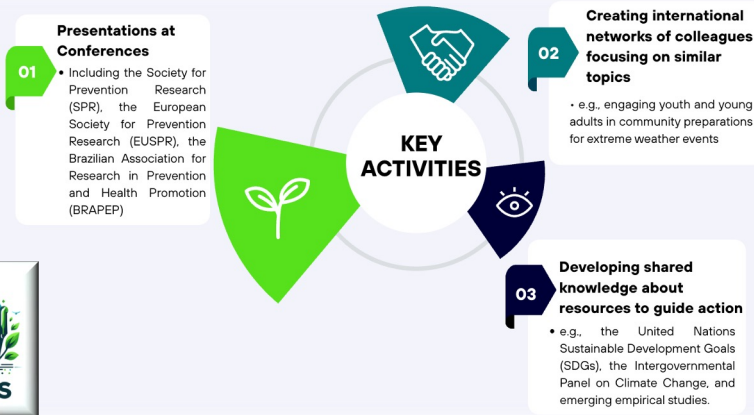
